Around the Classes...

Robin Class (Reception): We started off the week with the most amazing 'Outdoor Learning Day'. We spent every part of our day outside and the children commented on how much they enjoyed the day. Our No Outsiders text 'Blue Chameleon' looked at kindness and friendship and what we can do to help someone who may feel alone to brighten their day. Our story of the week this week is 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar'. We have been sequencing the story in order using the days of the week to help us! In Maths, we have been working on addition and subtraction to 10, using our Robin Class bus to help develop the concept.

Robin Class (Year 1): Welcome back for our final half term in Year 1. We started the week off with Outdoor Learning and our No Outsiders text Blue Chameleon, with the shared focus of friendship. We were enthusiastic in sharing greetings with our friends and were lucky with the sunshine which meant we could participate in outdoor activities such as making clay chameleons, natural painting and even wool wrapping chameleons! Our brand-new story of the term has started, 'The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch'. And finally. Maths has seen us consolidate our knowledge of multiplication and division, which is helping us with our Diamond Dash challenge too!

Kingfisher Class: Can you believe we are into the final half term of the year already! We had an exciting 'Outdoor Learning Day' on Tuesday which saw us spend the entire day learning in the great outdoors, which included some practical Maths and using sticks, leaves & stones to punctuate our chalk writing on the yard. In Maths, we have been continuing our fractions focus, using equivalent fractions to help compare, whilst in English we have been planning and writing our own poems using our text, 'The Owl and the Pussycat' as inspiration!

Partridge Class: Partridges have had a wonderful week back for the beginning of the final term! We began the week by creating our beautiful information pages about 'The Empire Windrush', ready to begin a new English topic. In Maths, we have been exploring rounding decimals as well as an outdoor lesson on dividing by 10 and 100! The children had a brilliant time in Forest School, exploring and being creators by building dens and peeling sticks. I am very proud of all the Year 4 children for taking part in their Multiplication Check this week; they showed great determination and resilience!

Woodpecker Class: Another fantastic week in Year 6! We enjoyed our final 'No Outsiders Day' on Monday focussing on the text 'The Spots and the Dots' and celebrating diversity. In Geography, we have found out why the Brazilian government chose to change the capital city and evaluated the positive and negative aspects of megacities. We have continued to flex our writing muscles by creating biographies of Elphaba from 'Wicked'. A great first week back – and a super start to the final term!
