Around the Classes...

Robin Class (Reception): This week, we have continued our focus on the 'beginning, middle and end' of stories, using our 'Drawing Club' story 'The Magic Porridge Pot'. We have used lots of vocabulary including gloopy, endless and covered. In Phonics, we have been building longer words (in both reading and writing) and we have developed our short sentence writing! In Maths, we have been focusing on 'pattern', which has included copying, continuing, action and number patterns before we finally created our own patterns! The children have wowed us with their creativity and amazing skills!

Robin Class (Year 1): We got off to a super start this week; phonics is coming along well, thank you for taking time with your children with the additional home sheets. Science has seen us be inspired as we participated in an experiment using liquid and gingerbread men! For Computing, we have explored programming using the programme Scratch. Our new history topic, 'What was the most popular toy in the 1960s?' saw us investigate why historians divide up time and we even got to play with some 1960s toys borrowed from the museum! And finally, we have consolidated place value within 20 in Maths and can now confidently use a number line. Awesome work!

Kingfisher Class: We had a strange but exciting start to the week! Many of the children had a brilliant time during the stargazing residential – they had lots of exciting things to share with us when they got back and the staff said they behaved impeccably. The remaining children joined with some children from other classes in school and were great role models. They particularly enjoyed using some of the 1960s themed toys to set up some activities for the Year 1 children. Back in school, we have continued with our measures unit in Maths and set up an egg-citing egg-speriment in Science!

Partridge Class: We have had a very busy week this week with year 2/3/4 enjoying their stargazing trip while year 5 enjoyed some 'Careers' Days' back at school. On Wednesday, the children completed writing their newspaper articles and were extremely creative by creating their own colloquial quotes for characters from South-East London. We have also practiced our French speaking through playing snap. Well done, Partridges!

Woodpecker Class: It has been a different week in Year 6, as we were joined by our friends from Year 5 on Monday and Tuesday where we undertook our 'Careers' Days'. We enjoyed finding out about aspirations and setting ourselves goals for the future, whilst also thinking about our future career aspirations. Back in our classroom, we continued to explore ratio and proportion and enjoyed planning our own fairy tales in the style of the Brothers Grimm in English. A great week Year 6!
