Y2/3 Stone Age Day

Next Tuesday, Year 2 and 3 will spend the day outdoors, with Wilderness Outdoor Education, on an exciting 'Stone Age Day' linked to their History topic. Children in Kingfisher Class should come to school dressed in outdoor clothes and shoes for the day. We'd be very grateful for a small donation of £3 per child to help us cover the cost of this day. Around the Classes...

Robin Class (Reception): This week, our key text 'The Tiger Who Came To Tea' has prompted lots of excitement. We have been creating lots of wonderful tea parties, writing invitations, and even had our own Forest School-inspired tea party. In Drawing Club, the children are working really hard to extend their creations and also write sentences and use patterns as their codes for the magic to happen! In Book Week, we really enjoyed sharing our love of reading, as we always do, by sharing a range of books and joining in whole school events across the week.

Robin Class (Year 1): Book Week has been wonderful - we've shared many favourite class texts, viewed the delicious 'Book Bakes,' recited the poem 'Mudlark' by Shirley Hughes and ended with the 'Big Read!' In Maths, we've been working on subtraction – using number bonds and counting back. In PSHE, we have been given a plant to take care of and we have daily roles to help. For History, ask us about the last Disney movie Walt Disney made in the 1960s! In gymnastics we have been jumping and landing with control, working hard to create a straight and star jump sequence. Another wonderful week!

Kingfisher Class: We have thoroughly enjoyed Book Week this week and I was so impressed by the children's performance of 'Scissors' by Allan Ahlberg on Wednesday – ask them to recite it to you at home! In English, we have continued to explore our new story named 'Black Dog', focussing on using speech punctuation accurately whilst in Maths we have completed our measures unit, where we have been comparing, ordering, adding and subtracting units of length. Another great week for the Kingfisher Class so a big well done to all!

Partridge Class: Year 4/5 have been very inquisitive this week! In Science, we created chocolate rocks to help us understand the process that sedimentary and metamorphic rocks go through to be created. We have also started our new Computing topic, physical programming. The children explored 'crumble' micro controllers and learnt how to make the LED light change colour. They also recited their poem 'Someone' by Walter de la Mare beautifully to the rest of the school. Finally, we have had lots of reports about how amazing our Year 5 children were when helping with the Coffee Morning so a big well done!

Woodpecker Class: Year 6 have worked really hard all week, completing their practise SAT assessments ahead of the 'real' assessments in May. We have been so impressed with their hard-working attitudes and determination to show off their skills in all subjects – well done Year 6. Alongside this, the children have enjoyed publishing their final drafts of their Grimminspired fairy tales, and begun to investigate algebra in Maths. In History, they have explored how what Mayan artefacts tell them about life in Ancient Maya.
