# Around the Classes...

Robin Class (Reception): The children really enjoyed sharing an egg hunt with grown-ups this week in Robin Class. The atmosphere was wonderful and all the children had an 'egg'xellent time! We have also been busy making some very special things for some very special people ready for the weekend. Our key text of the week has been 'Dear Dinosaur' where in Forest School we have enjoyed fossil excavating and noticed some interesting foot prints! I wonder who could have been in our Nectar Cafe...

Robin Class (Year 1): Another wonderful week has passed us and we have been 'happy and healthy' enjoying maths, counting to 50 outdoors in the sunshine. We have also been 'lifelong readers' in comparing parts of our text (Beegu) and 'risk takers' when attempting straight and barrel rolls in P.E.! In History, we have explored why there were no smart toys in the 1960s and we shared a discussion with someone special born in the 1960s, we loved her favourite toy 'Ted the Bear'. Kingfisher Class: Kingfishers had an incredibly exciting day on Tuesday when we had our 'Stone Age Workshop' on the village green; our Stone Age guest was incredibly impressed by our behaviour but even more so by the knowledge the
