### Around the Classes...

Robin Class (Reception): We started our week with a fantastic trip to Monk Park Farm. The children behaved impeccably and thoroughly enjoyed meeting a range of animals, including the newborn piglets! In Maths, we have been continuing our learning of doubles and noticing equal amounts/numbers. We have been writing number sentences to support this further. Our story of the week 'What the ladybird heard at the Seaside' has prompted lots of discussions about the adventures of Lanky Len and Hefty Hugh and we finished our week with writing a recount of our trip to the farm.

Robin Class (Year 1): A great start to the week being 'risk takers' during pony trekking at Catterick Stables; we cared for the ponies and excelled with trotting on them. For Geography, a great discussion was held about 'How is the seaside different from other places?' We even wrote a postcard to Mr Donaldson, explaining what we like to do at the seaside. We read like geographers, the text 'At the Beach' by Roland Harvey. Maths this week has seen us continue consolidating our counting in 2s. In English, we used adjectives to describe an alien and its personality.

**Kingfisher Class:** In Maths this week, we have been exploring fractions, finding fractions of shapes and objects using concrete and pictorial representations to support. We concluded our unit based on the story Black Dog by writing our own versions of the story – the children worked really hard with their writing and produced some great stories. In Geography, we started a brand new unit about the state of Nevada, which will see us comparing our own village to this overseas location. Finally, it was lovely to welcome some of our grown-ups into class on Thursday morning to show off some of our learning from Computing this term. Have a nice weekend hopefully with the sunny weather continuing!

Partridge Class: It has been such a lovely week, enjoying the sunshine and being back into the swing of things! It was brilliant to see some of you at the computing morning, the children really enjoyed showing off their knowledge of programming. The children began their summer topics for PE, rounders and cricket, being happy and healthy whilst showing great sportsmanship. We have also been very inquisitive in our English lessons, learning all about The Empire Windrush and the lives of those that migrated to England in 1948!

**Woodpecker Class:** We've had a very busy week in Year 6 exploring aspects of shape, space and measure. We have refined our protractor work and learnt how to calculate missing angles on lines and in shapes as well as sharpening our reflection our translation skills. In English, we have continued to recap our knowledge of grammar and punctuation concepts. We have enjoyed plenty of time outdoors beginning our new PE unit focussing on striking and fielding, and beginning to investigate computer systems in Computing.
