IMPORTANT: SICKNESS

Please could we remind all parents of the 48-hour rule regarding sickness from Public Health England: In general, it is recommended that any staff member or child with diarrhoea and/or vomiting symptoms must stay away or be excluded from the school or early years setting until they have been free of symptoms for 48 hours (the '48-hour rule') and feel well. Personal hygiene whilst ill must be very strict. If children return to school and share with staff that they have been absent with diarrhoea or vomiting then parents will be called to collect them until the 48-hour period has expired.

Around the Classes...

Robin Class (Reception): This week, we have been looking at the story 'The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch'. In Forest School, we had to find different things hidden in the outdoor area from his lunch basket and we've been working on writing speech bubbles as the seagull in the story. For Art Week, we created lighthouses (from our story) using some of the new techniques we have learnt. In Maths, the pesky seagulls have been stealing our shells and treasure - helping us with learning our subtraction stories 'first, then, now'. On Tuesday, we celebrated Bee Day, thinking about why it is important for bees to survive. We have also enjoyed helping to take care of the lambs. What a busy, fast-paced half term we have had! Robin Class (Year 1): We've had another wonderful week, meeting three new additions to school - the lambs! They have joined us in the Nectar Cafe for a little staycation. Another opportunity for us to take good care and to learn and understand the natural world around us, hands-on! Art Week has been incredible, creating woven wonders. We've read plenty of special texts and 'read like Artists'. We've been weaving, wrapping and even created a plait using ribbon.

Kingfisher Class: We kicked off the week in style this week with our class assembly; thank you to everyone who was able to attend, I am sure you will agree the children were all fantastic! We have had a great final week of this half-term, being creators during Art Week. The children have been working hard to design and make 'Egyptian Scrolls' and some of their work has been amazing – if you haven't already seen it, take a look on Facebook! We have also continued our Geography unit, this week comparing our own environment to that of Nevada whilst in Science; the children have been conducting experiments outside to explore how the position and size of shadows change throughout the day. A big well done to all of the children! **Partridge Class:** We have had a brilliant week in Partridge Class, exploring the rainforest during Art Week. The children created lots of beautiful artwork surrounding the range of colours, textures and elements of the rainforest! We have explored the artist Leonardo Da Vinci in our reading comprehension and enjoyed learning about his influence on artists and even scientists in the modern day. The announcement of Annie has also created a buzz in Partridge Class, we're very proud of all the children across the school who were risk-takers and auditioned for a role. I hope you all have a lovely break before the final school term! **Woodpecker Class:** Year 6 have returned to some normality this week following our SATS! We have fully immersed ourselves in Art Week, investigating photography and creating some very interesting work. In English, we have enjoyed developing our tone by creating Trip Advisor reviews and persuasive letters.
