Around the Classes...

Robin Class: We started the week by learning about Remembrance, creating our own poppies and marking the event with a 2-minute silence to show our respect. On Tuesday, the children arrived to a very messy classroom...the children have been investigating clues to try to work out who they think has made the mess. Within provision, they left out traps to try and catch 'Goldilocks' and received a letter from her in return! Following this, our key text in 'Drawing Club' has been Goldilocks and the Three Bears! We have been using fantastic codes to create places for Goldilocks to hide and maps for the bears to follow.

Kingfisher Class: Kingfisher Class have worked very hard all week. They have enjoyed further developing their addition skills — learning how to use number lines to count on. Year 1 have worked hard with adding to teens numbers, whilst Year 2 investigated larger 2-digit numbers. In English, they have written emails and in Science, they have investigated what changes happen between autumn and winter. The children really enjoyed their first History lesson on Monday — creating a timeline of their own lives using

We linked our reading comprehension to a class favourite text: Stubby – A True Story of Friendship. In Maths, we have started to develop our column subtraction skills. Our History investigation has started as we consider 'Who is the greatest history maker?' We've been 'happy and healthy' daily, co-ordinating a 25 step dance for Children in Need.

Partridge Class: Partridges have been amazing this week. They've worked so hard in all lessons! In English, we have started our new book 'FArTHER' and have asked some interesting questions about the front cover. We have been showing brilliant sportsmanship in PE, supporting our peers in football. In Maths, we have been developing our additions skills, using concrete resources to model the process of column addition before moving on to written methods. We also loved the excitement of Children in Need and being on TV! Another great week, well done to all.

Woodpecker Class: We kicked off the week with a Remembrance Assembly on Monday morning with the children paying respects with a 2-minute silence. In Maths, we have consolidated our use of long division before moving onto BODMAS and we have once again been incredibly impressed by their attitudes. In English, we have been distinguishing between 'facts and opinions' whilst in History, we explored how the major city-states of Ancient Greece (Sparta and Athens) were similar and different. And finally, the children were brilliant during our 'Crucial Crew' visit on Wednesday afternoon, learning about how to keep safe in a variety of contexts.
