Around the Classes...

Robin Class: We have started to feel incredibly festive in Robin Class this week! We have been reading about the Nativity story, which has fed, beautifully into our rehearsals which are going incredibly well – we are so proud of how confident all of the children are! Alongside this, we have had the Nativity scene set up within provision which the children have really enjoyed exploring. We have also been really excited by our class 'Christmas Post Office', with the children enjoying basing much of their role-play around this. Another great week for our Reception children – have a lovely weekend everyone!

Kingfisher Class: We are fully in the swing of our rehearsals for a 'King is Born' and are very impressed with the children's effort so far. You should have received a letter earlier in the week with information about the performances and costumes. Thank you for your support with this. In Maths, we have continued to investigate subtraction, whilst in English we have used our understanding of plurals to write recipes. We have continued our work in History by thinking about how we celebrate special times. Have a lovely weekend.

Goldfinch Class: The children have all really aspired with their learning this week. In English, we have been using adjectives and noun phrases to complete a character description all about Goldilocks and we are thoroughly enjoying our class story, 'Planet Omar Accidental Trouble Magnet' which we are approximately half way through. We have explored how magnets attract and repel in Science and in History, we learned more about the great history maker Grace Darling (this has inspired us to be 'change makers' with the hope of fundraising through a bake sale - details to follow soon). And finally, we ended the week being 'creators' by making 3D paper angels for the Nativity Trail for families to view around the Lower Wensleydale churches.

Partridge Class: Partridges have had another brilliant week. On Monday, we explored hieroglyphics in History and investigated how the Ancient Mayans would write messages; we wrote our own names as well as our birthdays and ages in codex! We also explored the story of Adam and Eve in RE, recognising that if you do something bad, there may be a consequence. The children also showed great sportsmanship and teamwork in their intra-sport competition on Wednesday, with Richmond taking home the victory!

Woodpecker Class: A big well done to the Woodpecker children who were able to support with the Christmas Fair on Wednesday afternoon – as always, they did a brilliant job and are a credit to the school! In Maths, we have been exploring angles this week, calculating missing angles using our knowledge of straight lines, circles and triangles. In Music, we have been layering sounds and rhythms, further developing our knowledge of the inter-related dimensions whilst in History; we enjoyed acting out the story of the 'Trojan Horse'.
