Around the Classes...

Robin Class: Our adventures this week have seen us delve into the stories 'Room on the Broom' and 'What's in the Witches' Kitchen?' We have enjoyed using these to support acting out the stories, and making our own potions within provision in our very own kitchen. Will it be something 'delicious' or 'disgusting'? In Dough Disco, the children have been manipulating dough, to music, into different shapes to support building finger strength for handwriting! We ended the week with our whole school DT days - where we created our own junk models. We had to individually plan the resources we wanted to use to effectively make our unique junk model 'Monsters'! What fantastic creators and imaginative minds we have in our Robin Class!

Kingfisher Class: Kingfisher Class have had another hard-working week. They have continued to impress us with their writing as they put the finishing touches to their information texts about pets. In Maths, we have continued to refine our understanding of place value and solve reasoning problems. We have enjoyed ending the week with our 'Design Technology Days' where we made some impressive windmills and evaluated how successful they were.

Goldfinch Class: A 'happy and healthy' week for us! We thoroughly enjoyed our PE lessons, developing an understanding of tactics in cricket as well as teamwork and instructions in outdoor adventures. It was wonderful to see all of the children participating with huge smiles on their faces. In Geography, we created leaflets encouraging people to visit Richmond using our wealth of knowledge from our fieldwork study. Finally, we ended the week with DT, where we focused on structures; we were 'risk takers' and 'creators.' Thank you for coming along to see our work.

Partridge Class: Partridge Class have been exploring measure in Maths. We have been converting measurements of items in the classroom and even wrote a realistic recipe using grams! In RE, we explored the gospel of John and how Jesus represented himself. The children created their own 'I am...' statements, recognising different attributes they have! The week has ended with a very exciting DT topic of bridges. The children were risk takers, using saws and wood to create their own trundle bridges.

Woodpecker Class: This week in maths, Year 6 have been applying our multiplication skills to a range of problems, particularly focussing on their clear explanations using mathematical vocabulary. In English, we have been exploring subjunctive mood as we continue our work on The Inventions of Hugo Cabret whilst in Reading Comprehensions, we have been learning more about Water Aid in preparation for our Harvest festival next week. We ended the week with our Design Technology unit, which started with building our own Empire State Buildings out of straws before creating our own structures.
