Around the Classes...

Robin Class: Wow what an end to the first half of the spring term! We have learnt so much this half term, including learning all about space! We have extended our writing to begin to write captions and short sentences, developed our handwriting amazingly and finished off learning all about 2D and 3D shapes! This week, we have enjoyed art week and making marks to music using a range of media. We have also been using nature-inspired paints and brushes to create 'mud paintings'. Another amazing half term. Well done Robin Class - have a very well deserved rest. ☺

Kingfisher Class: What a great end to the half term! In Maths, we have continued our investigations into measures by investigating mass. Year 2 have been investigating kilograms and grams, whilst Year 1 have used non-standard measures to weigh objects found in our classroom! In English, we have enjoyed showcasing how far our writing has come in our extended writing challenge. We have also really enjoyed art week. We have thought carefully about primary and secondary colours to create super outcomes using paint. Well done Kingfisher Class!

Goldfinch Class: We loved starting the week off with an assembly all about 'Climate Action' and sharing our knowledge about earthquakes. Internet Safety Day was interesting and gave us all a great insight about ways in which we can keep safe online. We've all been inspired and became creators during art week, our artist focus was Henri Rousseau, we got very messy with pastels! We wrote our very own narrative about a castle; the creativeness was flowing! We have also managed to complete our class text, The Iron Man which the children have really enjoyed. Have a wonderful break!

Partridge Class: It's 'Art Week' and Partridges have had a brilliant time exploring painting & mixed media through portraits. We began the week exploring Piet Mondrian and his abstract style, recreating 'Composition 1'. They even created their own mixed media compositions, using a range of resources and materials! We have also been creating our own stories in our independent writing challenge – I was so impressed with their original ideas. Well done Partridges, I hope you all have a restful half-term break!

Woodpecker Class: We have definitely been 'creators' in our final week of the half term. In English, we have been completing some independent writing based on an image, using our imaginations to take our stories wherever we wanted. The children took a lot of care with their work and the final products were great. In Art, we have been analysing famous artwork from various artists, using key vocabulary to help critique it before creating some artwork of our own. And finally, we have continued exploring decimals in Maths, understanding place value of numbers with three decimal places – our fractions, decimals and percentages work will continue after half-term!
