### Around the Classes...

**Robin Class:** This week we have enjoyed our Drawing Club which has been based on 'Whatever Next' and our focus vocabulary 'zooming', 'accelerate' and 'soaring'. In provision, we have been creating rockets with our large construction resources... and smaller rockets in our creative area. Our 'Curiosity Cube' this week was all about Neil Armstrong. The children have enjoyed learning about him and why he is an important person from the past. The children are really enjoying learning more about space!

**Kingfisher Class:** We have had a fantastic start to the term. This week, we have started a new sequence of learning in our Maths lessons by investigating multiplication as 'lots of'. Whilst Year 2 practise their multiplication skills, Year 1 have refined their place value skills. In English, we have written some super sentences about 'Jim and the Beanstalk' using conjunctions. We've also really enjoyed starting our new geography topic based on food by thinking about how milk is produced and flexing our muscles in the gym!

**Goldfinch Class:** Welcome back, we are working extremely hard with wonderful, positive attitudes to our learning. In Maths, we have consolidated our addition and subtraction journey, including calculations with money. In Computing, we have delved into 'Programming', which the children are really enjoying, and the children loved sharing their special items in RE. Handwriting has been beautiful this week; we have really focused on our presentation. And we have started our new class text of The Iron Man, which we are thoroughly engaged with. Please remember to keep reading at home as often as possible – we are enjoying handing out the raffle tickets and pasta for 5 reads per week. As always, I have been proud of how the children care-aspire-excel in school.

**Partridge Class:** What a brilliant week Partridges have had! They have worked extremely hard and have been so successful in their learning. In Maths, the children have been focusing on time, developing skills in reading, writing and converting time between analogue and digital as well as using a 24hr digital clock. In Geography, we were changemakers; after a walk around our school, we discussed ways in which we could be more sustainable and created posters to persuade people to do so. Well done, Partridges!

**Woodpecker Class:** In Maths this week, we have moved onto 'fractions, decimals and percentages', initially focussing on how we can find equivalent fractions, simplify fractions and comparing/ordering fractions with different denominators. We will spend quite a large part of the term working on this unit, as there is a lot of content to cover. In English, we have continued exploring persuasive writing, focussing on how we can use persuasive vocabulary and a range of punctuation to enhance our work. In Geography, we started a brand-new unit exploring how climate change affects the world. The unit will see us travel to different continents around the world, with this week's focus being on drought and famine in The Gambia. Another brilliant week – well done to everyone!
