Dear Parents,

We have had another brilliant week in school with lots of exciting learning going on in each class. We are having a big push on the 'fundamental skills' this year, ensuring children have a strong foundation of skills (in reading, spelling, handwriting, number and speaking & listening) in which to build upon throughout their primary education and beyond. It has been a pleasure to go and see some of the spelling and handwriting sessions being delivered around school this week; we are seeing a great improvement in children's handwriting, resulting in high-quality outcomes across the curriculum. They should be very proud of the effort and care they are taking with their work!

I also had the pleasure of speaking to a group of children about Science on Wednesday afternoon and they were incredibly excited to tell me about some of the fantastic experiments going on around school. On Wednesday, Y3 children were crumbling chocolate (they resisted eating it!) to demonstrate rock formations, Y4/5 were using materials to test thermal insulation using ice cubes and our after-school Science Club made their own lava lamps! Lots of exciting activities which really brought their learning to life.

Around the Classes....

Robin Class: This week in Robin Class, we have enjoyed taking part in the RSPB birdwatching by taking part in a number of bird-inspired activities! We've also been very creative this week in our exploring time, creating vending machines, laptops and binoculars just to name a few! We've continued learning different facts about space with a little help from our 'Look Inside Space' non-fiction text! We have also been working incredibly hard with our handwriting and our letter formation is really coming on – well done to all of the Robins!

Kingfisher Class: Another busy and fun week in Kingfisher Class. This week, we continued to develop our understanding of multiplication as 'lots of' by exploring arrays in Maths; we have also enjoyed investigating alternative versions of our text 'Jim and the Beanstalk' in English. We are enjoying learning more about Hinduism in our R.E lessons and investigating 'Why are there so many dairy farms in Devon?' in our Geography work. Well done Kingfisher Class – keep it up!

Goldfinch Class: We got off to a super start, embracing our learning in Geography which has seen us delve deeper understanding how New Zealand has been affected by earthquakes in the past and what is considered as 'serious' on the Richter scale. We have come to the end of our 'Me and You' journey in English, where we consolidated writing our own narratives. We have grasped the start of multiplication and division, being real risk-takers in our work! We were inquisitive during our Sikhism session and will end the week with a fantastic Big Read.

Partridge Class: This week, we have started our multiplication and division topic in Maths. The children have been deepening their knowledge of multiplication, learning about factors and multiples. In R.E, we explored how Hindus show their faith at home by creating our own Mandir. The mystery of the Endurance has had us all hooked in English, with some of the children being very impressive and completing their own research at home. Well done Partridges.

Woodpecker Class: The children have continued to impress us with their knowledge of fractions this week, where we have been converting between improper fraction and mixed numbers before adding up to three fractions with different denominators. In English, we have moved on from persuasive writing to planning our own piece of discussion writing, considering both sides of an argument. We continued to explore how climate change is affecting the world, this week visiting Australia and learning about the impact of rising temperatures and how this results in more bushfires. Finally, we will have our half-termly Big Read to end the week, with the children sharing some stories with our younger children in school, sharing their passion and love for reading!
