Around the Classes...

Robin Class (Reception): This week we have started our Drawing Club adventure with our first book 'The Colour Monster'! The children have been using a range of exciting vocabulary such as discombobulated, enraged, shimmering and tranquillity with accompanying actions! Each day we focus on drawing a different element (character/setting/adventure days) and have magical codes which change our picture! Every child has shown curiosity and awe delving into the world of imagination where we have had the most magical time enjoying mark making and writing with meaning in a fun and engaging way! In other news we have enjoyed pirate dancing, learning the 'Harvest Apples' poem, creating our own leaf creations with the 'Leaf Man' book and beginning to explore Autumn treasures in our outdoor environment. Another busy week of learning!

Robin Class (Year 1): A 'happy and healthy' week for the Robin class. We all thoroughly engaged in our PE lessons, exploring speeds and actions through a pirate inspired dance and during our fundamental lesson, we were changing direction and dodging. It was wonderful to see all the Robins participating with a huge smile on their face. We've been outdoors in Maths, collecting numbered pebbles and making rockets to blast off! We can now count backwards from any number within 10. We have been reading as a geographer and exploring the world map and globe, finding the United Kingdom and our school. To celebrate National Poetry Day, Mr Cope came to share a poem with us. And we ended the week with the Big Read, sharing books with our assembly partners. Well done for this week Robins!

Kingfisher Class: On Wednesday, Year 3 children had a fantastic day at cross country at Richmond Secondary School. The children represented school really well and were 'happy and healthy.' Back in school, Year 1s joined the Year 2s to do some great partner work to solve some maths problems. The children worked really well together to find all the possibilities. We have begun our new unit of 'addition and subtraction' and have been looking at number bonds and fact families. Today, we discovered a backpack in the classroom that had been left by an explorer. This linked to our new book 'Dear Earth' which we will be working on for the next few weeks in English. In French, we learnt how to say 'What is your name?' and 'My name is....' Another great week, well done Kingfishers.

Partridge Class: What an amazing week. We are all so proud of the children for being risk takers and taking part in cross country this week. It was wonderful to see their determination to do us (and themselves) proud! We have been busy this week researching the life of Harriet Tubman in English. In Maths, we have been exploring rounding and negative numbers as well as beginning our new topic of Addition and Subtraction. Finally, in Science we answered the question 'What is special about our local area?' by creating a visitor guide about the wonderful habitats that we have here in Hunton!

Woodpecker Class: We have continued to work hard in Year 6. In Maths, we have continued to enjoy our learning about the four operations by investigating 'special numbers' such as primes, factors and squares. We worked hard on using our multiplication skills to support and extend our learning. In English, we have learnt about the silent film genre and written our own reviews for the film, 'Hugo' which is inspired by our 'Literacy Tree' text. We've enjoyed investigating how leaflets persuade tourists to visit the Yorkshire Dales in Geography and continuing to be happy and healthy in our PE lessons in Dance and TAG Rugby. Well done, Year 6!
