Around the Classes...

Robin Class (Reception): The children have been exploring their senses with Miss Hayden in our 'Curiosity Cube' this week, sparking lots of discussions and have explored a range of activities throughout the week focusing on their senses! To extend our enjoyment of mixing colours this week, we have been adding textures and painting on different surfaces. We started our timetabled maths inputs this week and the children have blown us away with their engagement and enthusiasm! Following on from this the have shown high levels of engagement going on number scavenger hunts in the outdoor provision. Our story of the week 'The Day the Crayons Quit' has introduced the vocabulary 'fair, persistent and quit'. It's been lovely to watch the children using this throughout the week alongside our actions to be persistent and not 'quit' and notice when others are doing the same... 'They are being persistent and not giving up'! Amazing! **Robin Class (Year 1):** What a fantastic week of learning! We loved participating in the whole school trip to the 'Foxglove Covert' to support our science learning. We loved exploring and finding clues, even in the rain! In our maths lessons, we have continued to put our place value knowledge to the test by counting on from a given number. English has seen us retell the narrative 'Cave Baby'. We thoroughly enjoyed the story 'Jonah and the Whale' in RE and learning what the bible teaches us about God. A super ending to the week, celebrating European Day of Languages and exploring France through fun sports!

Kingfisher Class: What an inquisitive week we have had! On Wednesday, we had a fantastic morning at Foxglove Covert where we went on a nature walk, found lots of interesting animals when pond dipping and explored different skulls. When we returned to school, we continued with our science learning by exploring the different microhabitats we had in the Nectar Cafe. We found lots of centipedes, worms and woodlice. In English, the children have impressed me with their writing skills as we have written our own circus story. The children have made their writing interesting and included all the skills we have taught the past few weeks. In Maths, we have been ordering numbers.

Partridge Class: What an exciting week! During our visit to Foxglove Covert, the children embraced the wet weather and were very inquisitive during pond dipping. We also explored different classifications of animals on the reserve, relating to our science topic 'living things and their habitats'. We continued being happy and healthy in PE, exploring what dance movements would best represent the theme of being a spy; the children definitely represented their sneaky side! Finally, to celebrate National Day of European Languages, the children have created beautiful continuous line drawings of French landmarks.

Woodpecker Class: Another great week of learning in Year 6! The children really enjoyed their morning of scientific enquiry at Foxglove Covert on Wednesday, and also brought together their findings from their Geography fieldwork visit by using their research to investigate why the Yorkshire Dales are so popular with tourists. In Maths, we have started to investigate calculations by sharpening our addition and subtraction skills. We were also really proud of the four children who represented our school at the history workshop at Green Howard's Museum on Monday.
