Can You Get Rainbows in Space?


March's Book of the Month is only our second non-fiction winner! We understand that lots of children love information books and devouring all of the new facts about their chosen subject - but this catagorises loads of scientific facts into colours so you'll cover all sorts of subjects!

Can You Get Rainbows in Space is an exceptional nonfiction book that explores the world of science and space by looking at each colour of the rainbow. The book starts by explaining how we see light and colour and then dives into each colour of the rainbow and shares key facts about it. For example, readers will learn that hippos have red sweat, blue eyes are actually clear with no pigment at all, and that overripe bananas glow indigo under ultraviolet light. The book also covers various aspects related to each colour, such as why the seas are blue or why leaves turn orange in Autumn.

Beyond exploring the colours of the rainbow, the book also covers parts of the spectrum that are invisible to the human eye.


Once the colours have been explored, the final section focuses on rainbows - how to make them, what they represent before finally answering 'Can You Get Rainbows in Space?'

This truly is a colourful book that will bring joy to any child (or adult) that gets their hands on it.

This is Me!




