## Q&A with Natasha Hastings



This month's **BOOK OF THE MONTH** is the wonderfully wintery 'The Miraculous Sweetmakers: The Frost Fair' by Natasha Hastings. The story follows Thomasina and her family as they pin their hopes of happiness on the magic of a mysterious visitor. Obviously with a book called *The Sweetmakers*, I need to know what your favourite sweets are?

Rhubarb and custards, lemon sherbets, and mint imperials.

Great choices. I loved the description of when Thomasina and the other Londoners first saw the frozen Thames. What is your earliest awe inspired memory?

I remember when I first saw snow (apart from as a baby, I suppose). It covered my street, including the lampposts and our neighbours' cars, like a quilt, and I took a picture on a polaroid camera my mum had at the time. I remember feeling amazed that snow and ice can change the feel and character of a place so entirely.

The illustrations by Alex T Smith are amazing, what is it like seeing someone else illustrate and interpret your ideas? Are they the same as you imagined or are there subtle differences?

I feel so lucky to work with such a talented illustrator. It's surreal and heart-warming to see the story I wrote come to life. I'm not very good at visualising things in my head, so didn't know what to expect, and think Alex conjured up the feeling of excitement, wonder, and adventure I want readers to feel while reading *The Miraculous Sweetmakers & The Frost Fair*.

So many magical books are set in the Winter, why do you think it is seen as such a magical season?

The long nights provide an enchantment of sorts in winter, I think: amid the darkness, imaginations can be sparked. Winter

is also a time when there's a real sense of community - whether that's strolling along Christmas markets, singing along to festive music, or gathering to eat. What are your favourite recent books for children

Sadé and Her Shadow Beasts by Rachel Faturoti, Hedgewitch by Skye Mckenna, and Einstein the Penguin by Iona Rangely.

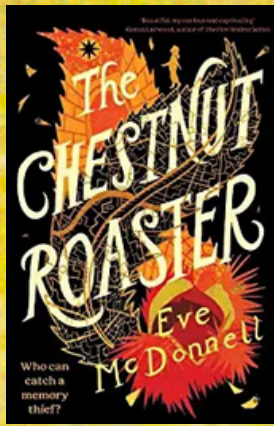

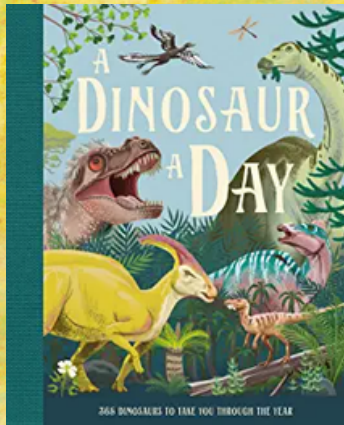

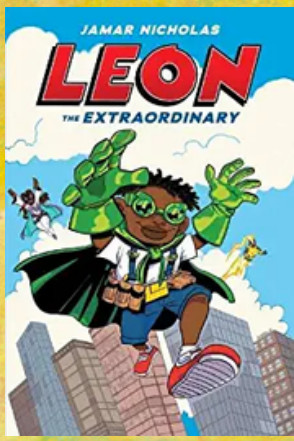


## One To Wait for...

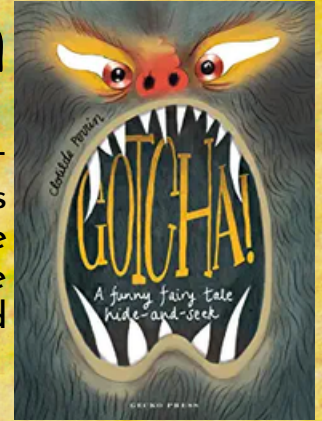

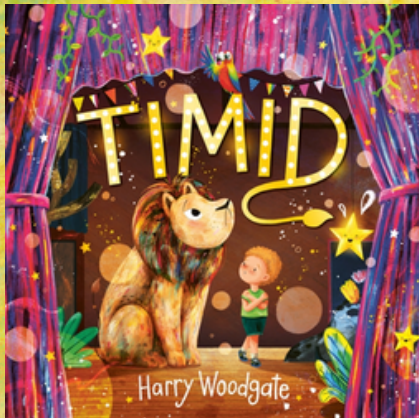
# Gotcha
