#### Around the Classes...

**Robin Class (Reception):** This week we have enjoyed looking at where we live and where our school is on the map! We've also enjoyed reading our key text 'Only One You' talking lots about being different - unique and special! Our treasure boxes have been a huge hit over the last 2 weeks, where we have been discussing our families, things we like and holidays with our new friends. The children have started their weekly phonics sessions and have absolutely blown us away with their amazing attitude and drive already!

**Robin Class (Year 1):** Robin Class have had their first PE lesson this week, focusing on underarm throwing; I witnessed some fantastic throws! We have had a great start to our phonic lessons, revisiting familiar sounds. It has been very exciting in English, with our focus text 'The Colour Monster'. I have loved seeing everyone start the sentence with a capital letter. Maths, has seen us sort objects, ask us about all the different buttons! They have worked extremely hard, and I have been really impressed with their attitude towards learning this week.

**Kingfisher Class:** The Kingfishers have continued to settle in exceptionally well and Mrs Kawai-Calderhead have been so impressed with them. In maths, we have continued to develop our place value skills, grouping objects into tens to help us count to 100 and in English, we have been exploring instructions. The children began their work into science by exploring life cycles and in Geography we continued to develop our map work skills. As you may already know, we have had some inspectors in this week and I must pass on that they were so incredibly impressed and complimentary about the children's behaviour, attitudes to learning and how respectful they were so a huge, huge well done to everyone!

**Partridge Class:** In Partridge Class we have had a very busy week! We have started our English topic based on our fantastic new book called 'The Butterfly Lion' by Michael Morpurgo. We continue our work on place value in Maths. In Geography, we used the atlas to find the 10 most populated megacities in the world. We have also loved the start of our science topic, where we were looking at what makes a balanced diet. Another great week in Partridge Class, we have been very impressed once again!

**Woodpecker Class:** This week the Woodpeckers have begun their learning about National Parks, ready for our trip next week. In PE, we have had fun learning the 'v dribble' and used our bodies to defend when playing basketball. We have also enjoyed beginning our place value topic in Maths and were really creative in English when writing instructions for witches' potions. The visitors earlier in the week couldn't speak highly enough of the oldest children in school – we are very proud!
