#### Around the Classes...

Robin Class (Reception): This week all the reception children have blown us away with their phonics knowledge - so driven and focused. They have learnt so much this half term- and continued to aim high, by working hard on their oral blending, decoding words and starting to write words this week! Wow! They have really enjoyed listening to and acting out 'Room on the broom' and creating their own story map! They have also enjoyed creating various spells and potions in the witch's kitchen, exploring what's inside a pumpkin, making wands and hats to support their play and lots of drawing!! Another fantastic week learning!

Robin Class (Year 1): The Robins have had another highly productive week where they have most certainly lived up to our ethos of careaspire-excel, both in and out of the classroom. To celebrate 'This is Me Week' we have listened to our song of the week many times. We all printed our fingerprints and explored them using the magnifying glasses, did you know that no two people have the same fingerprint? We have loved sharing our likes and dislikes and celebrating we are unique. Outdoors, during forest school we even linked 'This is Me' and used mud to make fingerprint patterns and clay portraits! In English I was so impressed with their Autumn poems, a variety of exciting vocabulary was used. And we had another very successful time learning catching skills in our cricket session, with coach Joe.

Kingfisher Class: This week the Kingfishers have been working hard in English to write their letters all about our school. In maths we have continued to develop our place value skills, particularly our counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. On Thursday, the children competed incredibly enthusiastically in our termly 'intra-house sport competition', definitely living up to our 'We are Happy and Healthy' aim. We have also been working on our Harvest Festival performance this week with the children fine-tuning their singing and speaking parts ready for next week. The children have settled so well into year 2 and it was incredibly rewarding being able to share with you all how well they are

Partridge Class: We have enjoyed our 'This is Me' week and we have celebrated how we are all different. We looked at diversity, equality and individual liberty and rounded off the week with 'Free Dress Friday'. It was yet another sporty week in Partridge Class. We had another superb cricket workshop, a fantastic basketball session and a group of children represented school in the Y3/4 football tournament. The children worked really well as a team and showed excellent sportsmanship skills. We are all very proud of you.
