Around the Classes...

Robin Class (Reception): This week the children have enjoyed exploring the Autumn season and have taken a particular interest in ensuring our outdoor area is clean and tidy from all the falling leaves. We've been working hard to develop our gross motor skills sweeping, picking and transferring whilst working as a team!

In Drawing Club our book focus has been Christopher Pumpkin. We are so proud of not only the children's enthusiasm for Drawing club, but also how all the children's pencil grip, control, imagination, and detail in their drawings are developing each and every week! It's by far our highlight of the day! In PE this week we have been doing cricket with our cricket coach - the children enjoyed learning skills needed for cricket and showed great determination and perseverance!

Robin Class (Year 1): We have had an exciting week this week with lots of fun things going on. We loved participating in the first Cricket skills afternoon with coach Joe. We have been looking at the book of poems 'Out and About' by Shirley Hughes in our English lessons this week, we look forward building skills to write our own Autumn poem next week. It has been wonderful to see all the children being enthusiastic with their reading books, sharing both at home and in the classroom. This is why we are 'Lifelong readers' at Hunton school. Our class read, 'Dogger' also by Shirley Hughes has been fully enjoyed. We have been looking at fewer, more and the same in maths this week. The children have really impressed me with their efforts on Numbots too!

Kingfisher Class: The Kingfishers have continued to work incredibly hard this week. In English, we have been writing letters based on The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch, giving advice on how to protect their lunch from 'pesky seagulls'! In maths, we have moved onto comparing and ordering objects and numbers, developing our understanding of the inequality signs. In both geography and reading, we have been learning more about how symbols can be used to help us with map reading whilst in PE we had an exciting cricket workshop with a coach from the Yorkshire Cricket Board which will continue each Tuesday for the next few weeks. Another great week for our Year 2s! Partridge Class: We have had another brilliant week in Partridge class. On Tuesday, we had our first session with Joe the cricket coach from Yorkshire Cricket Board. The children demonstrated excellent behaviour and enjoyed developing their cricket skills. In maths, we moved onto our new topic 'addition and subtraction.' The children continue to impress with their Times Table Rockstars skills and are enjoying competing in the tournaments. In English, we have been looking at a discussion text called 'Do we need zoos?' In science, children became scientists for the afternoon and created a model of the human digestive system using crackers, bananas, orange juice and tights among other things. It was a creative (and also rather gross!) way to show how food moves through the body. The children had lots of fun learning about the part that the stomach, small and large intestines play in the digestive system.

Woodpecker Class: This week in Woodpeckers we have started our new maths topic 'four operations' and learned how to complete column addition and subtraction. The children improved their cricket skills on Tuesday during their cricket session ran by the Yorkshire Cricket Board. This activity was enjoyed by all and the children are very excited to keep practicing cricket over the next few weeks. In English, we have been looking at how we, as authors, can paint a picture in the readers mind by using figurative language. The children have been fantastic at this and came up with some great similes and metaphors.
