Around the Classes...

Robin Class (Reception): This week our story of the week has been 'Zoom Rocket Zoom' and 'Lost and Found' in Drawing Club! Following children's interest in the Arctic - we have been looking closely at the North and South Pole - exploring animals and habitats, going on adventures and learning facts about both the Arctic and Antarctica. We can locate these on a globe! We have really enjoyed conducting an experiment to see if we can get a rocket to 'launch' and 'zoom' into the air and lots of activities related to the RSPB Bird Watch (this weekend). We have sent you all a sheet home so you can watch and wait....to see how many birds you can spot! We'd love to look at these next week in class with the children to see who found the most different species.

Robin Class (Year 1): We have loved being independent and getting organised for our learning routine with positive attitudes towards all our tasks. We had a huge task in English this week – to write a fact file all about space! I was so impressed, the children found out some amazing facts and included adjectives! We even remembered about Neil Armstrong from a previous History lesson. The children have had a great time in Computing exploring the programme 'Scratch Junior' to begin to investigate programming. In Science we are exploring the quickest way to melt ice, we love investigations and talking like a scientist!

Kingfisher Class: The Kingfishers have been working hard on their diaries this week, basing it on our class story 'The Stinky Cheese Man'. They have tried really hard to include some description and use conjunctions to make their sentences more varied and each has done a great job. In Maths, we have moved onto our unit of money, counting in pounds and pence and making amounts using notes and coins. In Science, the children have been fascinated by their 'mouldy bread' experiment, monitoring any growth we have had so far. Also, on Tuesday, we attended an exciting online webinar about a bird watching project we can take part in which will keep the children busy throughout the next few weeks of forest school. An incredibly windy and busy week so well done to all!

Partridge Class: We all have been creators this week in our English, the children have created gripping story openings inspired by a mysterious image from the Mysteries of Harris Burdick book which we have been reading in story time. They have included some fantastic descriptions and created suspense. In maths the children have been using the bus stop method for division, tackling 2 and 3-digit numbers and even navigating reminders! Meanwhile, in science, we collated our results from our 'which biscuit is the most 'dunkable' to create bar a chart.

Woodpecker Class: This week Woodpecker Class have sketched some fantastic portraits of influential change makers, ready for the Art Gallery. In Science the children have designed, made and tested their own parachute using their knowledge of air resistance. They really enjoyed working with Mrs. Kennedy in Computing to create advertisements using iPads where they had to be really creative and think of 'spy features' they would like to promote!
