Around the Classes...

Robin Class (Reception): This week has been extremely egg-citing! Our little chicks have hatched and made an appearance in the Robin classroom. The children are beyond excited and have taken to the role amazingly, taking care for them and following our golden rule to be kind. What a wonderful experience. This has provoked some amazing writing and drawing. In Maths we have been thinking about what two numbers make 5, and extending to what two numbers make 10 altogether (number bonds to 10). Following on from our litter picking, taking care of the environment we have focused on 'Somebody Swallowed Stanley' and 'Clean up' and what we can do to help our environment as 'change-makers'.

Robin Class (Year 1): A short week, however, we have filled it to the brim! We have loved the text 'What the Ladybird Heard at the Seaside', and this helped us to write a diary entry for our recent trip to the seaside. During our trip we completed a fieldwork survey, so went have spent some time in Geography collating our findings. The children enjoyed reading and asking questions. And finally, the most exciting thing happened this week... the chicks hatched! They pipped and zipped out of their shells, and we now have 6 fluffy chicks in the classroom, which we have been taking great care of.

Kingfisher Class: Despite missing a day on Monday for Bank Holiday, we have been incredibly busy in Kingfisher Class this week. We have finished our fraction unit in maths, moving onto two-quarters and three-quarters, using pictorial and concrete methods to help solve problems. In English, we have been using our imaginations to write creative stories including speech – the children have produced some brilliant work and I have been incredibly impressed! In Science, we have been using knowledge from a previous experiment to grow our own plants, ensuring they have the right conditions and everything they need.

Partridge Class: Partridge Class have been busy writing a diary from Paddington Bear. They have produced a fantastic piece of writing which really captures how Paddington felt when he first arrived in London. In maths, we have finished our work on money and have begun our next topic: 'Time.' In science, we found out how plants make food and also set up an investigation to see how water is transported around a plant. We have placed carnations and celery in some coloured water and now will use one of our scientific skills, 'observing over time,' to see what happens. It has been Miss Spence's last week with us, she has worked incredibly hard with the children, and we would like to wish her all the best as she heads back to university.

Woodpecker Class: It has been a busy week in Woodpecker Class as we have worked hard to use protractors in Maths whilst also learning how to find missing angles in triangles and quadrilaterals. We've spent lots of time revising key concepts for our Year 6 children and know they are ready to show off all of their learning next week. The children have worked hard in their Geography lessons investigating more about Mountains and enjoyed finding out about Evolution in Science. In English, we have used an unusual picture as a stimulus for telling an adventure story. The children's grasp of grammar and punctuation, as well as ambitious vocabulary has resulted in some super writing. I hope everyone (but especially Year 6!) have a restful and relaxing weekend
